Common Grackle: Found by Greg Gray at Moxon Dairy in Arcata. A 3rd Humboldt record. Twenty-six eBird checklists were submitted for this bird between October 24 and November 5.

Eastern Yellow Wagtail: Found by Keith Slauson on September 24 on Cannibal Island Road in Loleta. This 2nd confirmed Humboldt record stayed until at least September 27, allowing ~ 20 people to see it.

Masked Booby: Sighted by Charlie Giannini November 22 from a boat within a half mile of shore near Humboldt Bay entrance. First Humboldt sighting of this species.

Northern Wheatear: Found by Keith Slauson September 18 in the McKinleyville Bottoms near the Hammond Bridge. This 2nd confirmed Humboldt record was seen by many observers (39 eBird checklists) through the following day.

Roseate Spoonbill: Found by Alex Benn on October 31 in Mad River Slough near the bridge on the way to Lanphere Dunes. This juvenile was a first Humboldt record. Spotted about a week later near Fernbridge.
