





23rd Annual Student Bird Art Contest at Godwit Days

Co-sponsored by Friends of the Arcata Marsh (FOAM) and Redwood Region Audubon Society (RRAS)

Humboldt County students from K through Grade 12 are eligible to enter.

Prizes: Up to \$650 may be awarded; divisions to be determined based on number of entries received.

Submission Rules: One entry per student. Maximum size of artwork, including any border material, is 8.5" x 11." (A4 art paper, 8.3" x 11.7," is also acceptable). Artwork must be light enough to be pushpinned to a wall for display. Subject must be a bird listed on the back of this flyer or another locally occurring species. Show off your skills using non-digital media (no photographs or computer-generated graphics), from paint to charcoal, graphite, markers, pastels, and more. Entries with glued-on components (e.g., glitter, twigs, grass) or created with pastel chalk must be submitted in plastic sleeves. Do not frame. Entries submitted by individual students, rather than through teachers, must include an envelope with sufficient postage stamps to cover return mailing cost. The following must be written legibly on the back of each entry: species of bird being depicted; student's name and grade number; teacher's name, e-mail, phone number, and school mailing address. Return of Artwork: It is highly recommended that classrooms — especially those located at a distance — enclose a self-addressed return envelope (minimum size, 9"x12"), using postage stamps. Allow until mid-May for return of entries. Return packages must weigh less than 13 ounces. Entries lacking return envelopes will be held at the Arcata Marsh Interpretive Center until June 1 for teachers to pick up.

Announcement of Winners and Artwork Display: Winners will be announced and awarded prizes on April 18 during a ceremony at the Arcata Community Center (ACC). All entries will be posted in the ACC during the festival (4/17-19). Color copies of winning art will be displayed at the Arcata Marsh Interpretive Center during May and June. Winners' names will be published in the FOAM newsletter and sent to local media. A booklet of all winning artwork and any artist photos taken during the awards ceremony will be posted at www.rras.org, www.arcatamarshfriends.org, and www.godwitdays.org.

Deadline for Receipt of Entries: 5 p.m. on Saturday, March 21. No submissions will be accepted after this cutoff. Either drop off at the Arcata Marsh Interpretive Center, 569 South G Street, Arcata, or mail to Sue Leskiw, 155 Kara Lane, McKinleyville CA 95519.
